We were warmly welcomed by the organisers and they even had a tent for us with chairs. We were the very first Australian team to compete in the regatta so expectations were high. We did not disappoint, winning our first race. Cheryl swept and mastered the 10's boat amazingly taking a slightly zig zag course to give the other teams a chance!

We were stoked and the sun came out and stayed out for the rest of the regatta. Lots of red tinged shoulders could be seen by the end of the day. We paddled in 3 heats coming 1st, 2nd and 2nd. Our grand final loomed, we paddled hard and strong and came in 4th. It made our overall standing 12th from a field of 21 teams in the Mixed category. Celebrations commenced immediately in the Irish pub a few steps away from where we had marshalled!

It was a wonderful experience for the team and we had a lot of fun.

At one stage during the day, it was full on with the racing and other times, there was time for paddlers to have a break before their next race. This was very much welcomed by all paddlers due to the warm conditions during the day.



Our proudest moment of the day was when the Club's **Senior C Mixed** (paddling with 8) – **DOUG, BRUCE, BOB, MARK, PEGGY, LYN, EVA and KAREN R, drummer MICHELLE F** and sweep **DEL**, won a bronze med-

al, just pipping 1770 over the line by **0.00.03**. Photo finish technology had to be used. The photo showed just exactly why paddling past the finish line is so imperative.





Although the other Redcliffe teams did not come away with any medals on the first day of racing, **Senior B Women 10's** made the Semi-Final while the **Senior A Open 10's and Senior B Open 10's** both made the Grand Final.

All paddlers put in 100% for the club, team and themselves on the day. Tomorrow was another day of racing and another chance to come away with some bling for the weekend.

Most of the racing on the day consisted of one heat and a final in each category due to the lack of team numbers with most paddlers experiencing the joys of paddling 6 x 500m races. Thankfully the conditions were cooler than the previous day of racing.

At the end of Sunday's racing , our club made all three grand finals and scored ourselves two silvers - one for Senior A Open and one for Senior B Open. Everyone came away from the State Championships with at least one medal be it bronze or silver.
