COME & TRY DAYS

One of the ways the club recruits new members is by having 'Come and Try' Days. These are in the form of **ADVENTURE WOMEN & ADRENALIN MEN**, and **OLDER & BOLDER**.

'Adventure' is a sport, fitness & recreation activity program introduced by Moreton Bay Regional Council for Adults 18 years and over who reside in the Moreton Bay region. It aims to challenge and provide new opportunities in fitness, sport and recreation for adults and link them with local clubs and organisations.

Participants can experience a variety of sporting and recreation activities in a friendly and supportive environment. Activities are designed for both men and women of all fitness levels and abilities unless otherwise stated.

Older & Bolder is an annual activity program presented by the Moreton Bay Regional Council for residents & ratepayers aged 50 years and over. It is held from September to November each year and gives individuals an opportunity to stay active and healthy and experience and enjoy passive, adventurous and cultural activities.



These events are usually very well attended. The club held an ADVENTURE WOMEN day recently. Redcliffe paddlers are scattered throughout the boat to provide assistance as the novice paddlers are taught the dragon boat stroke.



The club's next Come and Try Day will be an *OLDER & BOLDER DAY* being held on Saturday 19th September.

FUN DAY

In mid- May the club had a FUN DAY for the paddlers. This consisted of a series of fun games on the water. Games such as PINWHEEL RETRIEVAL, MILK RUN, SMALL BOAT RELAYS and TUG-0-WAR.

Two teams participated on the day TEAM RED and TEAM BLUE.





Although the *Pinwheel Retrieval* race felt more like a training run than fun, everyone enjoyed the competition.

Team Blue won the race but Team Red gained points also as they retrieved the special pin wheel leaving the teams tied after Round 1.

The Small Boat Relay in Round 2 proved to be a hit with the paddlers as they paddled in pairs in the time trial boats that are appropriately named PAIN & AGONY. It proved a challenge not only for the paddlers to manoeuvre the boats but also the sweeps.





Team Red proved too strong despite Team Blue's sweep bending the rules ever so slightly. Therefore at the end of Round 2 Team Red was ahead.

The *Milk Run* consisted of teams having to retrieve as many of the 30 half-filled milk containers, 3 rubber duckies and 1 squeaky mouse as they could within a specified time allowed. Each milk container was worth 1 point, each duck worth, 2 points and the mouse, 5 big points.

Although Team Red strategy was to collect the items with larger point value Team Blue won as they managed to pick up 21 containers scoring a total of 21. Team Red were only one point behind with 20 after retrieving the three ducks, one mouse and 9 milk containers.

At the end of Round 3, the scores were tied. The winning team on the day would be determined by which team won the final event - *TUG-O-WAR*. It was to be the best of three.



The *TUG-O-WAR* consisted of 8 paddlers from each team in the one boat. Each team had their backs to the other as they paddled against each other. Team Blue proved too strong in this event thereby being declared overall winner for the day.





Overall, everyone who participated enjoyed themselves and are looking forward to the next Fun Day.
