# THE PEISHING 10'S BOAT

- the story of how we purchased our new 10's boat 😊



Whilst our Club was attending the National Championships in Canberra, we were fortunate enough to hear that AUSDBF were selling the 6 year old "Tippy 10's" boats for \$3,000. The deal was that your Club had to maintain the condition of the boat and AUSDBF would hire it for the Nationals in Penrith next year for \$500 hire fee. They would also pay for the boat to be transported to and from Penrith in 2020. The only catch was that they needed to be taken away at the end of the Regatta as there was no storage room for the boats due to new boats having been received.

I was quickly on the phone to President Bob, explaining the situation and what the deal was. In his wisdom, he gave approval for the club to express our interest. Of course by now, our coach, Charlene was getting very excited. We were lucky enough to secure one of the boats along with Penrith purchasing two. Then began the arduous task for Charlene, Iciar and myself trying to find someone who would transport the boat back to Qld for us.

Being Easter, it was impossible to get people to reply to us and the ones that did weren't interested as it took up too much room. We were now desperate and so Jason and myself drove to Canberra and hired a car trailer.



By now we were feeling pretty chuffed we had organised something and then came the next hurdle- THE SAFETY OFFICER. He wouldn't let us leave the premises with the boats on the car trailer as too much overhang. After much discussion, AUSDBF agreed they would store the boat for us while trying to arrange transportation and we would work the costs out. They too had trouble and eventually found someone to take our boat along with the boat Penrith had purchased, to the Regatta Centre at Penrith and from there we would try and arrange transportation to our compound.

Arrangements were tried to be organised for the next following couple of weeks but no one could be found to tow the boat at an affordable price. It was then we went to PLAN B - Jason and I drive to Sydney on the weekend of 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> August with the boat trailer and bring the boat back.



When I contacted Jane Howard from the Penrith Dragon Boat Club, to arrange a date and time for us to pick up the boat, they were very accommodating. Jane was surprised to hear from me as we had not been in contact for a couple of months due to us trying to decide the best way to have to boat towed to Qld. When we arrived at the arranged time of Sunday afternoon, everyone

was so friendly and welcoming and help us load the boat on the trailer and retrieve the other items from their container which were still wrapped and stored away for us. Once the boat was loaded, they all headed out for their training session and Jason and I started the trek back home.



We had a great trip back and now the new boat awaits us to start using it to get accustomed to paddling in a 10's boat ready for the upcoming National Championships at Penrith over Easter next year.

This boat will help make us more competitive, so let's all relax and enjoy it.

# 2019 WORLD DISTANCE OHAMPIONSHIPS



On Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> August 2019, our very talented coach *CHARLENE POVEY* represented Australia in the 2019 World distance championships in *Masters 50 Women V1 category 16km* which was held in Mooloolaba on the Sunshine Coast and hosted by Australian Outrigger Canoe Racing Association (AOCRA).



There were 10 entrants in the category coming from Tahiti Canada, New Zealand, California, Germany, New Caledonia, Brazil, Singapore and Panama. Starting off Charlene held forth position throughout the entire race and after a gruelling 16km on the water that is the position she crossed over the finish line in a time of **1:54:37** behind paddlers from Tahiti Canada and New Zealand. Winning time was **1:42:40** 

Charlene had worked so hard that at the end of the day she had to be carried out of the boat and was quickly wrapped in a Mylar blanket. It wasn't long before she was feeling much better and the customary smile appeared on her face. Charlene said that she was very happy with her achievement considering



who her competition was.



All the hard work, commitment and determination ensured that Charlene achieved her best result possible.





21st August - 25th August saw the 14th IDBF World Dragon Boat Racing

Championships, being held at the Royal Navy Rowing Training Centre, Khlong Bang Phai Reservoir, **PATTAYA-RAYONG Thailand.** There were 4000 athletes, 30 countries and 6 continents participating at the event.

Australia (AURORAS) was well represented over all categories – under 16's through to Senior C's - in all racing divisions of 200m, 500m, 1km and 2km in 10's and 20's boats.

The club had three paddlers in the Aurora squad – *TAHLIA HARLE* (Juniors), *CHARLENE POVEY* (Senior B) and *BRUCE MUSGROVE* (Senior C)



All three paddlers were very successful in gaining some more bling for their pool room. They did everyone proud in their achievements.

The State of Origin races (100m in distance) saw several of Redcliffe paddlers being picked for the two Qld teams as well as two paddlers for the NSW teams. This year the honours went to NSW with two club paddlers

**CHERYL** and **GERRY** happily paddling in the winning NSW team in a time of **37.93.** 

Sunday saw the club competing in the *Mixed 20's, Women 20's and Open 10's.* The Women 20's (paddling with only 18) and Mixed 20's made the final with the Open 10's just missing the finals by *0.4secs*
