## History of Dragon Boating

Archaeological records show that dragon boats were raced in China more than 5000 years ago.

They were initially used only for ceremonial purposes, until the famous poet and statesman Qu Yuan died some 2300 years ago by drowning. Qu Yuan's death is commemorated by holding annual dragon boat races.

On the 5<sup>th</sup> day of the 5<sup>th</sup> month in the lunar calendar is one of China's most popular festivals – the Dragon Boat Festival.

The Chinese dragon is an ancient mythical creature, also known as the River Dragon or Dragon King. Although fearsome and powerful, the dragon was worshipped as a benefactor capable of providing enough rainfall for bountiful rice harvests.

The presence of the dragon is strongly felt at dragon boat festivals, when its heartbeat pulses through the dragon boat competitors.

The most popular account of the recognition of the 5<sup>th</sup> day of the 5<sup>th</sup> month relates to the story of Qu Yuan, a respected and well-loved patriot, poet and statesman. Qu Yuan threw himself into a river upon learning of the fall of his state to a major adversary, after having been branded a traitor by his king for warning against the rival state's intentions. This was on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of the 5<sup>th</sup> month.

When learning of the drowning reached the villages, the local fisherman raced out in their boats to try to save Qu Yuan. To preserve his body, the locals paddled their boats up and down the river, hitting the water with their paddles and beating drums to scare evil spirits away. They threw lumps of rice into the river to feed the fish, so that they would not eat Qu Yuan's body. Dragon boat races are said to re-enact the villagers paddling to Qu Yuan's rescue.
