#### 6. Reports:

Debra Hall moved vote of thanks to Norma for her leadership and service to the Club.

Treasurer - attached at Appendix 2 and accepted via member vote.

Lisa noted that across the year ie July 2021 to June 2022, the Club's funds had decreased by \$3,004.37 - which was the approximate difference between the grant funds received for the floor epoxy recoat and the job's total cost.

Lisa also noted that the Club had raised an impressive \$14,000.00 (approx.) through our fundraising efforts. She reinforced that fundraising events are often enjoyable social experiences for those who participate and that "many hands make light work".

Discussion focused on the dilemma of balancing the competing needs of the Club's membership ie sports paddlers v/s 'wellness' paddlers.

Moving forward, a sub-committee (volunteers) will organise a Come and Try to specifically recruit sports paddlers.

#### 7. General Business:

- a) Peggy Rapley was presented with the Club President's Award as she was absent from Presentation Night.
- b) Club Fees for 2022/2023 season

**Motion:** That the Redcliffe Red Dragons Membership ratify the Club membership fees for the 2022/2023 season as:

- \$150.00 pp for an adult full year and \$75.00 for a junior full year ie 1st July 2022 to 30th June 2023;
- \$75.00 pp for a half year ie 1st January 2023 to 30th June 2023;
- \$37.50 pp for a quarter year ie 1st April 2023 to 30th June 2023.
- Other Water Sports' Club members 25% discount on full year membership fee ie \$112.50 pp. - with Treasurer to confirm fees paid via receipt or otherwise so as to confirm discount prior to raising of RRD invoice.

**Vote: Motion Carried** 

NB: The DBQ membership fee (of approximately \$90.00) is in addition to that above and will be invoiced directly by DBQ.

Council is currently installing the infrastructure for user pays electricity across the Club facilities in Talobilla Park. The Club will need to set up a contract with an electricity retailer. It was suggested that in the future the Club could apply for a grant to install solar panels on the Shed's roof to reduce this cost.

**Motion**: That the Redcliffe Red Dragons Membership rejects the proposal from BNCA to partner with them to run the dragon boat racing and come and tries at this event scheduled for Sunday, 18th Jun 2023 at Pelican Park Clontarf. **Vote: Motion Carried** 

#### g) Bunnings BBQ Rothwell - Saturday 2nd July 2022

This coincides with the Tin Can Bay Regatta which the Club is attending. Rather than cancel this fundraiser, Scarborough Outriggers are helping out and the profit will be split 50/50.

#### h) The Loft - update

Alerts have been positioned in the access way to this area to reduce risks. Members needing to access the loft should be accompanied by a 'spotter' to minimise the risks of hitting their heads on the rafters and support beams.

The Committee will get a quote from a local Certifier to provide a report on works required to the mezzanine area to achieve compliance with standards for a storage loft.

#### i) TE WAKA Regatta - Sunday, 7th August 2022

RRD have been asked to supply and transport 2 x Gen 4 dragon boats to Lake Kawana to support this regatta. **Cherie Robinson** agreed to transport our boats.

#### 8. Other Business

- Gillian asked about reinstating the security camera system after the break-in. The
  insurer has very recently reimbursed RRD for this item less \$250.00 excess. The
  \$749.00 reimbursed (amount corrected from meeting) will not meet costs of
  installing a like-for-like replacement. The Committee will liaise with Jaycar Redcliffe,
  the original suppliers, with a view to update the system so that the recording is
  more easily accessed eq to a member phone.
- Iciar asked for a coaching-get-together to be held in the near future so that Charlene, Kay and herself could work out a program to support one another to deliver the 3 training sessions per week.


The 2021/2022 season kicked off slowly. Queensland had several short shutdown periods due to Covid and saw a spike in Covid cases after the borders were open in December. The effect of this can been seen further in my report.

Our membership base has changed considerably over the season. We lost approximately twelve members when Fraser Coast became directly affiliated with DBQ and gain approximately twenty-nine new members. Currently we have 81 members registered on RevSport. I need to stress even with this number of members the club continues to struggle to have the numbers at regattas and the volunteers needed at fundraising events.

At previous meetings we have pointed out that our membership fee (currently \$140 per member) does not cover the ongoing expenses required to run this club. Membership fees is another agenda item, but I would like to advise again, without our Come n Try's, Bunning BBQ's and other fundraising events we would not be able to continue. Everyday expenses are on the raise and should be addressed when discussing next year's Membership Fees.

In closing, my time as President 2021/22, Secretary 2020/21 and my short stint as Vice-President 2018/19 has been great. However, due to work and family commitments I need to step away. #### **TEAM MANGERS REPORT 25th JUNE 2022**

Since the last team managers report back in February, there have been 2 regattas States and Nationals

Redcliffe had a small contingent of 21 (4 male and 17 female) paddlers in attendance at the State championships held at Kawana Waters entering crews in Senior B Women 10's 500m and 200m and Senior C Mixed 10's 500m, 200m and 1km.

Congratulations to Senior C Mixed 10's 1km crew on their bronze medal. They were the only crew to medal.

The Nationals were held in Adelaide in April. Due to lack of numbers Redcliffe only entered one crew i.e Senior B Women 10's paddling in 200m 500m and 2km over the first 2 days of the championships and the girls did themselves and the club proud in winning a very well earned bronze for 500m. It was a fantastic by all the girls. It may have only been a bronze but to us all it was GOLD even if rose gold.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> day which was State v State saw 9 Redcliffe members representing Qld Tina, Cheryl, Ann, Phil and Jenny (also team manager) Senior C, Theresa and myself as Team Manager Senior B and Natalie B and Lani and Cheryl (also as team manager) in Prems. All Queensland teams excelled on the day coming away with a total of 12 medals – 7 GOLD, 4 SILVER and 1 BRONZE over 3 of the 4 divisions.

As Phil was in attendance as a State rep he was able to paddle with Manly at the Nationals due to non participation of Redcliffe. He was successful in coming away with Gold Senior C Mixed 10's 2km and Silver Senior C Mixed 10's 500m

The last two days of the competition saw Ann paddling with the SCDA Mavericks in the Breast Cancer survivor races coming away with a Gold 200m and Silver 500m.

Fantastic effort and congratulations to everyone with so many Redcliffe members representing not only the club but their State at these championships and doing so well. Just goes to show what you can achieve if you prepared to put in the commitment and the hard work.

Well done also to Kay and Jenny for representing the club in performing their officials duties of the 5 days of the competition.

#### **REVSPORT**

On July 1<sup>st</sup> AusDBF will be rolling over RevSport and once that is done all members will be shown as UNPAID and club Team Registrar will be sent information to invoice all members. The only payments members are to make to DBQ via RevSport is the \$90 DBQ levy fee to cover them for insurance. Club fees are paid into club account once they have received an invoice from the club. Club membership forms are to be completed and returned to Team registrar.

There is a 2 week grace period for insurance coverage for members. It is advised once members receive their invoice from RevSport they pay within 14 days so they will be covered once the grace period ends. Members are responsible for updating their information on RevSport if it changes throughout the year.

Thank you to everyone for continuing to register for the club's training sessions. It helps to determine numbers and sweeps required for each session.

Leading up to this you pick a couple of regattas to target for prep such as Burleigh and a couple int o the new year to gauge your fitness

So, the program now is really focussing on your fitness and technique. As you get closer to the targeted regattas the program starts to change – increasing the intensity to bring in speed work, starts, specific distances.

Difficulties with this is the commitment to training.

As I have mentioned before the club meets all the requirements of being a club such as activity based, welcoming, fitness, wellness, inviting, inclusive....

A factor of this success is due to our ages

There is 81 members: 41 are 60+, 25 are 50+, 15 are under.

Age group for racing is mainly the senior B up

I believe this is affecting our commitment to training.

As we are getting older to consider preparing for events we all need to a little bit more.

Example Me - 2018 I was long, short course and 500M national champ, racing in China, Tahiti,
 Thailand. I want to race at the next long course event in November. I have tostart training now. I can not rest on my lorals

This is in some ways how I think people are thinking.

To produce the results - results are racing a race well - getting a place is a bonus

The effort needs to be put in consistently not a weekout.

Proof is in the commitment to training. Monday, Wednesday lucky to get a full boat, Saturday is the same. Because of this continuity of a training program is very hard to maintain.

I have to point out that it is not just this club or sport – at the moment it is very common. SOCC experience the same problems there is a core group of paddlers then a week out from a regatta people turn up. Consistency of training is also very hard to maintain.
