
A huge thanks to the committee for their support and Andrea Coe for taking on the newsletter.

# **Coaches Report**

## Coaching Update – Lisa Dunne (Level 1 aspiree)

Hello All,

For anyone who has attended training sessions over the past 6 weeks, I have commenced the accreditation process to obtain my Level 1 Coaching in Dragon Boating. This has included:- updating my Blue Card, obtaining my First Aid and CPR certificate, attending the 2 day course, completing the online modules, planning and executing 10 training sessions and having 3 of these assessed by an accredited coach. Iciar is also obtaining her reaccreditation for Level 1, so it is great to have such an experienced colleague supporting my endeavours.

I have enjoyed the training sessions I have coached so far, and taken on board the feedback given by participants and coaches. I feel well supported by the club as a whole. We are currently in our endurance part of our season, so clocking up the k's whilst focusing on timing and technique is our focus at the moment. I am always looking for ways to incorporate what we need to do with trying something new. Now Currumbin Regatta has been cancelled, we are looking to submit teams for the next Regatta in October. ## **Team Managers Report**

## The Te Waka regatta on Sunday 7 th August.

Redcliffe competed with four paddlers from Fraser Coast in the mixed standard boat 100m; Open and Womens 200m Relay race; and the mixed standard boat 1000m.

10 teams competed in the Mixed Standard boat 100m, with Redcliffe coming 7 th from the combined times of 3 races. While it was close racing between the bottom 6 teams Sunshine Coast were on average 2 seconds faster than Redcliffe over the 100m.

10 teams also competed in the opens and womens 200m relay race with Redcliffe coming second last. Redcliffe was hampered by having to use only 8 paddlers in the womens leg, however the women managed an almost 3 second improvement from their first race to their 3 rd race. Over the 2 legs the average boat was nearly 8 seconds ahead, while the overall winner, Sunshine Coast was on average 18 seconds quicker than Redcliffe over the 2 legs of the relay.

Well done to Phil for completing two of the required four regatta races to complete his sweep qualification. Hoping to get him fully accredited at the Burleigh Regatta.



Redcliffe also competed in the mixed 1 km race achieving a good result of fourth in a time of 5 minutes 20.23 seconds, after close racing. This time was less than 2 seconds behind third place.

Thanks also to Sean and Bob for towing the boat trailer and club trailer.

This legal advice would include how to manage the volunatry wind up of the Club.

And you do not need to provide a seconder for your nomination. A seconder will be requested from the floor on the day of the AGM. You may also nominate yourself.
