

AusDBF and DBQ 2023/24 season fees



The fees for adult paddlers will increase from \$90 in 2022/23 to \$105 in 2023/24.

The 2023/24 membership fees are listed below.

	AusDBF	DBQ	Total
Adult Paddler	\$30	\$75	\$105
U24 Paddler	\$20	\$60	\$80
Junior Paddler	\$16	\$29	\$45

As of the 23/24 season membership will be subscription-based meaning that all memberships will last for 12 months from the date of sign up.

For most current members, this is 1 July each year. For new members, it will be from their date of transition from Dragon Pass to DBQ member or their initial registration.

Note: This fee is separate to the 2023/24 Redcliffe Red Dragons Club Fee. The Club Fee will be recommended to members at the next General Meeting, which is being held on Saturday 8th July at 9:00am.

Warm Banana Smoothie

- Prep Time: 5
- Cook Time: 0 minutes
- Total Time: 5 minutes

Ingredients

- 1 cup hot water
- 1 peeled ripe banana
- 1/4 cup chopped raw walnuts
- 2 or 3 pitted medjool dates
- 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1/4 inch knob of fresh ginger

Instructions

Place all ingredients in a high-speed blender and process until smooth and creamy. Serve warm.
